Skovshoved Harbor & facilities

Skovshoved harbor is located north of Copenhagen and in short distance to the center with train. The harbor has recently been expanded and modernized and is today one of the best harbors in Denmark for large international event. The harbor has all facilities required to give a high level of service to the sailors during the regatta as well as all type of hotels and camping facilities in short distance to the harbor.





There are large parking areas for cars, storage and trailers and even place for a number of mobile homes.

We have sufficient place for 150+ dinghies in the harbor and arranged in the same part of the harbor, in order to secure a compact event where the sailors can enjoy networking before and after the races. In 2016, we facilitated the ORC Worlds with 140 larger keelboats and 1200 sailors in this harbor.

At the harbor, we have two possibilities for social events, respectively a large boat yard hall – which we used during the ORC Worlds – or a large tent just beside the clubhouse in the northern part of the harbor – which we also use during large events, latest the X-Yachts Gold Cup during summer 2017.

Both facilities will be used sail measurements etc.





Our club premises will also facilitate race office, rooms for measurement team, meeting room for Int. Jury and all other functions during an international event to secure a smooth and seamless regatta organization.

The harbor also houses two boatyards with technical repair services, including riggers, hull repair etc. Further, there is a boat equipment store and a sailmaker. In addition, there are two restaurants at the harbor, one of them in our clubhouse, and a new food hall, with different street food type of food huts.

Proposed Dates & Schedule of event


The club can be reasonable flexible regarding dates for the event but would propose June or August.

Racing areas & sailing conditions

The location of the course areas will be close to the harbor, where Øresund – the Sound between Denmark and Sweden - provides a perfect and spacy racing area for every wind direction and weather conditions.

Predominant winds are westerly, with a wind speed average of around 8-15 knots. On warm days, a sea breeze can build around noon. Normally currents are below 1 knot in the racing area. In heavier conditions, the sailing area is relatively protected and therefor suitable for all type of dinghy racing on every level.

We have hosted events with 2-3 courses, all of them in reasonable distance from Skovshoved Harbor. In addition, there is no commercial traffic interfering with the race areas to secure fair racing for all.



Basis of Event fee (regatta & social)

Our proposal is based upon experience of running similar events. The entry is set to include the following:

- Measuring, setup, launching & recovery, car parking and trailer storage
- Berthing for the duration of the event
- Opening ceremony reception
- 5-6 days of racing
- Daily prize giving
- Prize Giving Ceremony Dinner

The entry fee per dinghy to be decided, and include the facilities described above.

We also maintain an on-line event entry and payment system, Manage2Sail, which will enable competitors to enter from any country. Other solutions might be possible, but we have to agree on this beforehand.

Race management

Our clubs have a very experienced race management team, which with regards to both all the staff on land and on water are volunteers drawn from our +2.200 members, and we have a number of internationally qualified race officers, very experienced course layers, security staff etc. The club has committee boats and many RIB's in order to facilitate large fleets and every type of courses, including the security aspect

The Race Management team will in every respect work closely together with the class using all the standard class documents and guidelines as well supporting in setting the measurement team and international jury.

Robotic sailing mark

RDYC has since 2022 been using robotic sailing marks wherever possible throughout the season. As well for small local regattas to international championships with more courses. This is also or aim to use it in your championship. This aims us in reducing the costs and number of volunteers used but more importantly is supports our quest in arranging sustainable events, where we already have achieved multiple awards.







Media and event reporting etc.

We will use its own photographers and our PR service together with OK class will ensure rapid publication of event reports and results. There will be a press office available for international media and photographers. A dedicated sub-site to be provided for general event news and information. Online entry, race documents, results and event notices will be provided through the Manage2Sail system.

Sustainability

The Royal Danish Yacht Club is proud to organize regattas according to the guidelines defined by the Sailors for the Sea and is committed to work for more sustainability in sailing. In the period 2021 to 2023 KDY received recognition for its efforts during several events being awarded with Platinum certificate.

It is the club's objective to continue the efforts supporting sustainability in major events in 2024 and ongoing. Some of the activities we already have used at major regattas to achieve the awards are

- Eliminate Plastic Straws
- Serve Food with Plastic-Free Dinner-ware
- Special reusable wine glasses and cups for soda water and beer
- Use or Provide Reusable Bags
- Involve Local Organizations
- Post Educational and Reusable Signage
- Ensure Proper Waste Bin Placement and Signage
- Divert Food Waste from the Landfill
- Use Paperless Event Management

Support Boats

Support boats will be required to register for an additional fee, this has to be agreed on before the event. This will include berthing during the event, which will be directed by the harbor captain of Skovshoved.

Travel logistics

There is easy transport by motorways through Denmark, including ferry connections from Germany, Norway, Poland and Sweden. Skovshoved Harbor is only 3 km away from the motorway in both directions.



The Kastrup International Airport is only 18 km from Skovshoved, and there is quick train connections to two stations, nearby Skovshoved Harbor, both in cycling or even walking distance to Skovshoved Harbour

Accommodation

There is a wide range of hotels, both in a short distance from Skovshoved, as well as in the central part of Copenhagen, less than 10 km. from the harbor. Closest hotels are:

Louisiana Museum of Modern Art

An international museum located outside Copenhagen that strikes the rarest of balances between art, architecture and nature. The art museum is located on the shore of the Øresund Sound in Humlebæk, 35 km north of Copenhagen, Denmark. The most visited art museum in Denmark, it has an extensive permanent collection of modern and contemporary art, dating from World War II to the present day; in addition, it has a comprehensive program of special exhibitions. The museum is also acknowledged as a milestone in modern Danish architecture, and is noted for its synthesis of art, architecture, and landscape. The museum is included in the Patricia Schultz book *1,000 Places to See Before You Die* and ranks 85th on a list of the most visited art museums in the world (2011).



Kronborg Castle – World Heritage

Kronborg is a castle and stronghold in the town of Helsingør, Denmark. Immortalized as Elsinore in William Shakespeare's play *Hamlet*, Kronborg is one of the most important Renaissance castles in Northern Europe

and has been added to UNESCO's World Heritage Sites list (2000). The castle is situated on the extreme northeastern tip of the island of Zealand at the narrowest point of the Øresund; the sound between present Denmark and the provinces of present Sweden that were also Danish at the time the castle was built. In this part, the sound is only 4 kilometers (2.5 mi) wide, hence the strategic importance of maintaining a coastal fortification at this location commanding one of the few outlets of the Baltic Sea.



Frederiksborg Castle

Frederiksborg Castle (Danish: *Frederiksborg Slot*) is a palatial complex in Hillerød, Denmark. It was built as a royal residence for King Christian IV of Denmark-Norway in the early 17th century, replacing an older castle acquired by Frederick II and becoming the largest Renaissance residence in Scandinavia. Situated on three islets in the *Slotssøen* (castle lake), it is adjoined by a large formal garden in the Baroque style.



Amalienborg, the royal castle

Amalienborg offers two royal experiences that let you get close to royal history through the last 250 years. In Christian VIII's Palace the museum offers an insight into royal life past and present. You can see the private chambers of former kings and queens and, on most days, there is also admittance to the royal reception rooms (check periods at our website) from the museum. In Christian VII's Palace you can walk in the footsteps of the royal guests, and be shown round the magnificent rooms where grand festivities are held. You can book a guided tour of Christian VII's Palace in the ticket office of Christian VIII's Palace or on our website. Remember that every day at noon you can watch the changing of the The Royal Danish Life Guards.



Tivoli Gardens

Tivoli Gardens (or simply Tivoli) is an amusement park and pleasure garden in Copenhagen, Denmark. The park opened on 15 August 1843 and is the second-oldest operating amusement park in the world, [2] after Dyrehavsbakken in nearby Klampenborg, also in Denmark. With 4.6 million visitors in 2016, Tivoli is the second-most popular seasonal amusement park in the world after Europa-Park. Tivoli is the most-visited theme park in Scandinavia, and the fifth most-visited theme park in Europe, only behind Disneyland Park (Paris), Europa-Park, Walt Disney Studios Park and Efteling.



Bakken - the world's oldest amusement park

Founded in 1583, Bakken, or Dyrehavsbakken as it is officially named, has been a firm favorite with the people of Copenhagen for centuries. During summertime families, young couples and seniors alike flock to the amusement park and the surrounding woodland to indulge in a day of fun. With a unique position in the middle of one of Denmark's most beautiful woods, it is like encountering a surprise in the middle of the greenery. The park offers a perfect blend of children's amusements, restaurants, pubs and bars with entertainment and live music. It's is not just a small children's amusement park but a place of leisure for the whole family. Because of its historic value and unique location, no big brands are allowed to set up stands at Bakken and neon signs are banned. Instead, a jumble of colorful wooden structures, small independent shop owners and quirky stalls meets visitors.





Nyhavn – 17th century waterfront

Nyhavn (New Harbor) is a 17th-century waterfront, canal and entertainment district in Copenhagen, Denmark. Stretching from Kongens Nytorv to the harbor front just south of the Royal Playhouse, it is lined by brightly colored 17th and early 18th century townhouses and bars, cafes and restaurants. The canal harbors many historical wooden ships.



Strøget – Europe's longest pedestrian shopping street

Strøget is a pedestrian, car free shopping area in Copenhagen, Denmark. This popular tourist attraction in the center of town is one of the longest pedestrian shopping streets in Europe at 1.1 km. Located at the center of the old city of Copenhagen; it has long been one of the most high-profile streets in the city. The pedestrianisation of Strøget in 1962 marked the beginning a major change in the approach of Copenhagen to urban life; following the success of the initiative the city moved to place a much greater emphasis on pedestrian and bicycle access to the city at the expense of cars. This approach has in turn become internationally influential.



The Viking Ship Museum

The Viking Ship Museum (Danish: *Vikingeskibsmuseet*) in Roskilde is Denmark's national museum for ships, seafaring and boatbuilding in the prehistoric and medieval period. The main focus of the museum is a permanent exhibition of five original Viking ships excavated nearby in 1962. The Viking Ship Museum also conducts research and educates researchers in the fields of maritime history, marine archaeology and experimental archaeology.



Canal Tours' Grand Tour of Copenhagen

Canal Tours Copenhagen is a wonderful way of seeing Copenhagen. Many Copenhageners take the tour to get an opportunity to see their capital from a different perspective.

Experience the idyllic harbors and canals of Copenhagen with a canal tour. The tour is guided in both Danish and English, and some departures have a third language, varying between German, Italian, French, Portuguese and Spanish. The tour takes approximately an hour.

During the tour, you will see: The Copenhagen Opera House, Amalienborg Palace, Christiansborg Palace, the impressive Black Diamond Library, and, of course, the Little Mermaid.



The Little Mermaid

The Little Mermaid (Danish: Den Lille Havfrue) is a bronze statue by Edvard Eriksen, depicting a mermaid. The sculpture is displayed on a rock by the waterside at the Langelinie promenade in Copenhagen, Denmark. It is 1.25 meters (4.1 ft) tall and weighs 175 kilograms (385 lb). Based on the fairy tale of the same name by Danish author Hans Christian Andersen, the small and unimposing statue is a Copenhagen icon and has been a major tourist attraction since it is unveiling in 1913. In recent decades, it has become a popular target for defacement by vandals and political activists. Mermaid is among iconic statues that symbolize cities; others include Manneken Pis in Brussels, the Statue of Liberty in New York and Christ the Redeemer in Rio de Janeiro. In several cases, cities have commissioned statues for such a purpose, such as with Singapore's Merlion.





The world's first Bike city

It is no wonder that The International Cycling Union, UCI, appointed Copenhagen the first official Bike City in the world from 2008-2011. In addition, that other cities, such as New York, look to Copenhagen for inspiration. Danish architect and urban planner Jan Gehl is famous for teaching other cities around the world how to plan for a bike culture. It even has its own term: "copenhagenization" or "to copenhagenize".
